Curbside Recycling Schedule

Recyclables must be set out on the curb by 8 a.m.

Mondays: Watson, Milan, Watson Road, Countryside Acres, Hacker Heights & Wegdahl

Tuesdays: Maynard, Clara City & Gluek

Wednesdays: Montevideo North – Residents North of black Oak Avenue, Smith Addition & Rolling Hills Estates

Thursdays: Montevideo South – Residents South of black Oak Ave.

Fridays: Montevideo Businesses

Drop Box locations for Rural Residents Open 9 a.m. to 9 a.m. the following day

Monday: Milan near City Hall

Tuesday: Clara City by the railroad parking lot

Wednesday: Montevideo in the rear parking lot at the Chippewa County Courthouse

Thursday: Maynard near the City Garage

Recycling may be taken to the Recycling Center located 4 miles East of Montevideo on Hwy. 7. Open M-F, 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

Key to a Successful Recycling Program

1. empty containers
2. remove labels / lids / covers / binders as necessary
3. wash / rinse out containers
4. sort properly
5. recycle items at appropriate designated areas

GLASS



YES:

- Glass food, beverage bottles and jars

NO:

- Drinking glasses, mugs, dishes, cookware, pottery, vases, window/mirror glass, etc.



NEWSPAPER

YES:

- Newspapers, inserts and advertisements
- Paper bags

NO:

- Plastic newspaper bags, rubberbands, etc.

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD



YES:

- Flattened cardboard boxes

NO:

- Large amounts. Please bring to the recycling center at the Chippewa County Landfill from 9 am to 4:30 p.m. M-F.



METAL



YES:

- Tin food cans, aluminum beverage cans

NO:

- Paint cans, Aerosol cans, or any type of can that holds any type of household hazardous waste product unless it can be completely cleaned out.

PLASTIC



YES:

- Containers and bottles marked on the bottom with one of the plastic recycling symbols (see above)

NO:

- Containers and bottles over 5 gallons
- Plastic wrap, shopping/ salt bags, etc.*
* Plastic shopping bags are recyclable at many grocery/ retail stores.

PAPER MAGAZINES PAPERBOARD



YES:

- Mail, office and school papers – white and colored
- Magazines and catalogs
- Telephone books
- Hard and soft covered books
- Shredded paper in closed paper bags
- Boxes: cereal, cracker, pasta, cake mix, toothpaste, medications, toiletries, etc..

NO:

- Soiled pizza boxes or boxes soiled with food
- Boxes from refrigerated or frozen foods
- Paper towels / napkins / plates / gift wrap
